Paul Abravaya to Present Birds & Other Wildlife from Costa Rica

Join us as zoologist and photographer, Paul Abravaya, presents beautiful pictures of birds and other wildlife, from his latest trip to Costa Rica.

Paul's interest in photography started with an interest in tropical nature. He took his first trip to the tropics in 1966, traveling as far as El Salvador by train and bus. In 1968, while working on his B.S. in zoology, he took part in a biological expedition to Panama.

Then from 1969 to 1974, while a member of the Peace Corps, he worked as a resident zoologist at the *Museu Mello Leitao*, working for Augusto Ruschi, Brazil's leading naturalist, conservationist and authority on hummingbirds, bromeliads and

small mammals. It was then that he discovered a new genus of mammal, *Abrawayomys ruschii*.

He continued to pursue several research projects including population ecology of small mammals, earned a master's degree in zoology and published his research in scientific journals. Since then, he's had a career as a biology teacher, and owned and run *Tropical Eco-Tours*, a tour business that introduced teachers and others to the fascinating tropical diversity of Costa Rica, Panama and Brazil.

Sunday, February 7 Malibu Creek State Park

Meet at the main parking lot at MCSP at 8 am. Entrance to parking lot is just south of Mulholland Hwy on Las Virgenes Road (1925 Las Virgenes Rd). Leader is **Aurelio Abaisa (818) 489-2836**. There is a per vehicle entry fee of \$12. A variety of birds are possible (chaparral species, raptors, woodpeckers, wrens, goldfinches and bluebirds likely).

at Sequoia Middle School and with the Sierra Vista Tree program are doing. The more time we spend in nature, the more we absorb the rhythm of her seasons and accept the amazing variety of her richness and diversity, and the more at peace we feel. 
