Don DesJardin presents õMore Birds & Other Natural Things Volume 5ö

Don DesJardin has been part of the birding scene in Ventura County since 1989. During that time he has spent countless hours capturing birds on both film and video. Although he has traveled to many exotic places around the world to see new birds and places, he always returns to what he calls his õlocal patchö.

õMore Birds & Other Natural Things Volume 5ö is the latest in a series of one hour õMore Birdsö videos which feature birds of Southern California, along with a sprinkling of other critters that are part of our natural world. The first 45 minutes are just birds which are identified with their common species names *only* at the end of each clip, so you can test your ID skills. The last 15 minutes is a short video õDawn to Dusk at the Salton Seaö filmed in the winter when 1000s of Ross's and Snow Geese, along with 100s of Sandhill Cranes leave their night roost at dawn and head out for their feeding areas, and then return at dusk to roost. This video is rated õGBö

(Good Birds), and is suited for Audubon audiences that cange get enough of them.

EDIBLE GARDENS AT SCHOOLS

Valmonte School in Palos Verdes Estates (where my boys went to school) has a new program, implemented by school children and volunteers. They have built an edible garden on a one acre plot. Wouldnøt it be great if each school could set aside an area for children to learn how to grow food?

Mulch was donated and Kellogg Supply sent heaps of soil amendments and compost. The Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy donated native plants. High School students and parents helped plant fruit trees and vegetables.

The program was instituted through **Enrich LA**, which Thomas OøGrady started in an effort to give back to the society that enriched him. The non-profit groupøs mission is to establish school gardens primarily in low-income areas. It aims to help youngsters learn about where food comes from and about nutrition, conservation and environmental stewardship. Gardens have been created along the 110 corridor where chain-link fences are topped by barbed wire. In most cases asphalt is removed to provide the garden space.

This program could be proposed at all our school districts.
