Conservation by Dee Lyon How To Cut Down on Food Waste

- 1) Take smaller more frequent shopping trips with specific lists. (Remember to combine shopping with other trips.)
- 2) Use the whole things -- skin on veggies, scraps into stock and gravies. There are tasty recipes for overripe produce.
- 3) Sell by date ---- means the date the store should stop displaying the goods. Food is usually good for several more days. See USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service/home service. Use your senses smell it.
- 4) Finish the leftovers throw them in a crockpot for soup or stew -- wrap them up in eggs for a breakfast burrito. Check out lovefoodhatewaste.com
- 5) Store food smarter. Freeze it if you won't use it in 2 or 3 days = #1 way to reduce spoilage in the kitchen

Day of General Meeting

Saturday, February 1, 2014 Veteran's Park

In Veteran's Park as many as all four species of sapsucker spend the winter, along with occasional Townsend's Solitaire and resident birds of the oak woodland and chaparral. We expect to see bluebirds. kingbirds, phoebes, juncos, sparrows, and if we are lucky, Red-breasted, Red-naped, Yellow-bellied and Williamson's Sapsuckers. If time allows we may also bird nearby Hansen Dam. Directions: Take the 118 freeway from Ventura County and head east. Take the 210 freeway west where the 118 ends. Exit at Hubbard Street and turn right. Proceed north (uphill) to Simshaw Avenue and turn left. Turn right on Sayre Street and enter the park, turning left immediately and parking in the lot at the end of the road. We will meet in the park at 8 am. Trip leader: Matthew Page (805)990-6534

Sunday, February 9, 2014 Lake Los Carneros

We will spend most of the day at Lake Los Carneros in Goleta, looking for waterfowl, finches, sparrows and chaparral species. Expected birds include Gadwall, Cinnamon Teal, Redhead, Whitetailed Kite, Mew Gull, Belted Kingfisher, Loggerhead Shrike, Hutton's Vireo, gnatcatchers, swallows, sparrows and more. If time allows we may stop at Andrea Clark Bird Refuge in Santa Barbara on our return trip. Directions: Meet and carpool at the Ventura Park and Ride at 7:30 am, or meet at Lake Los Carneros by 8:30. Ventura Park and Ride is at 6175 Ventura Boulevard in Montalvo, at the East Ventura Metrolink Station. Lake Los Carneros is best accessed via N La Patera Lane in Goleta, Ca. Take the 101 North and exit at Fairview Avenue. Turn right and then turn left on Calle Real. Turn right on La Patera Lane and park near the trailhead entrance to the park / lake. Meet outside the entrance to Lake Casitas at 8 am. We'll carpool or walk into the lake together. We'll explore the eastern arm of the lake, the Bald Eagle nests and look for wintering species. We'll also look around outside the lake on Santa Ana Road. Target species include Bald Eagle, Zone-tailed Hawk (unlikely), Golden-crowned Sparrow, Lewis's Woodpecker, White-tailed Kite and other woodland birds. Trip leader: Carol Langford (360) 742-6059

Saturday February 15 – Monday February 17, 2014 President's Day Central Valley Birding Trip

Limited space available for this unique opportunity to have insider tours of state parks and wildlife refuges in the Central Valley. Trip locations include Tule Elk SNR with a talk given by Bill Moffet, Pixley NWR for Sandhill Crane and Kern NWR. We will spend both nights at Colonel Allensworth State Park, with both the campground and the hostel available for lodging. Sunday, February 23, 2014 Arroyo Verde Park

In the foothills above Ventura Arroyo Verde Park is known for its many trails, abundant resident birds and occasional birds of note. Target birds include Cooper's and Sharp-shinned Hawks, woodpeckers, bluebirds and thrushes, nuthatches and kinglets and sparrows. Last year a White-crowned Sparrow was seen here, and Golden-crowned and Fox Sparrows are regularly found here in February. Directions: Take the 101 and exit at Victoria. Head north (away from the ocean) and turn left on Foothill Road. Turn right into the park. An entrance fee of \$2.00 is charged. Meet at the top end of the park at 8 am.
