## Saturday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> Marina Park

# Sunday, September 11<sup>th</sup> Santa Clara River Estuary

The Santa Clara River Estuary (SCRE) produces some of the most diverse observations of ducks, sandpipers, terns, gulls, plovers and other shorebirds in the county. We'll meet at Surfer's Knoll at 8 am and walk down to the estuary after peeking over the fence into the Ventura Settling Ponds. The estuary should be a great place to see Elegant, Forster's and Least Terns, Brown Pelicans, Western and Ring-billed Gulls, Ruddy Ducks, Avocets and Western & Least Sandpipers. Directions: From the 101 freeway, exit Seaward and proceed south to Harbor. Turn left and continue to Spinnaker, turning right to enter the harbor area. Drive past the Surfer's Knoll parking area on the left and make a U-turn to double back and enter the parking lot. Meet at 8:00 am.

August is here already. That means the fall migration is heading our way in only a matter of weeks, bringing with it flocks of those amazing warblers! This year CVAS will be having a pair of events focused on learning about and celebrating warblers.

First, we will be having our fourth year of our annual Warbler Bingo contest! For those of you who haven't played before here's how it works. As you go birding during the fall migration, you mark off the species on your card that you have seen. If you get five in a row, then you have gotten a bingo!

The first person to report a confirmed bingo to <a href="webmaster@conejovalleyaudubon.org">webmaster@conejovalleyaudubon.org</a> will win the tickets. Visit our website to pick up your card and enter for your chance to win tickets to our annual dinner and auction next spring. There will also be a limited amount of pre-printed cards at our first meeting of the year in September. However, the game begins on September 1<sup>st</sup>, so getting your card from the website will get you started on time!

Second, Frank DeMartino will be giving a Warbler Identification class on September 24<sup>th</sup> form 9 am until around noon. The class will cover migration, how to find warblers, how to **SEE** warblers, and tricky local warbler IDs. If that's not enough, it will also include a hot breakfast! The cost is \$10 for CVAS members and \$30 for non-members and will be held at Cal Lutheran University. Frank will send directions to the classroom when you register.

There will also be a class walk on September 25<sup>th</sup>, where we hope you will get to put your new warblers ID tricks to good use! Class size will be limited to 30 people and will be on a first come, first serve basis. Visit our website to sign up online.
