Sunday, March 6th Arnold Road/Ormond Beach

Join us at this excellent coastal location, where we will look for a variety of shorebirds. We should see Willets, Whimbrels, Black-necked Stilts, Black-bellied Plovers and other interesting birds. We will also look for Yellow-headed Blackbirds, Peregrine Falcons and Blue-Gray Gnatcatchers. Dress in layers as the morning may be chilly. Please bring a scope if you have one. Directions: Exit Hwy 101 at Rice Avenue and go south. Continue to Hueneme Rd. Turn right on Hueneme Rd. After Olds Rd. take a left on Arnold and continue to the end of the road. Please note: Avoid leaving valuables in your car if you are parking it at the end of Arnold Rd. There are restrooms at the entrance to the beach. Saturday, March 12th Ventura Settling Ponds

Join trip leader Frant DeMartino as he leads us around the settling ponds in Ventura to scour for ducks, herons, grebes, raptors and sparrows. Frank enjoys birding the ponds and has much local knowledge of the species we can expect. If time allows the trip may also visit Marina Park to look for rock pipers and gulls. Directions: Meet at the Las Posas Park and Ride to carpool at 7:30 am. By late March wildflowers should be well in bloom in the Antelope Valley. We may also see Loggerhead Shrike and Verdin. Our target birds of the day is the Black-throated Sparrow, a desert resident and striking bird to see perching in spring blooms.
