Friday, Nov. 3 - Pt. Mugu Naval Base

Sorry, this is open only to those CVAS members who have already completed and submitted the government form!

We'll explore the amazing wetland habitat around Pt. Mugu. Target species include Brant, Black Skimmer, shorebird species, Vermillion Flycatcher, and more!

Sunday, Nov. 12 - Mt. Pinos

Join us as we go into the mountains to find some alpine birds! We will carpool at 7 am from the Janss Park & Ride located on the east side of the 23 freeway at the Janss Road Exit by the soccer fields. Alternately, meet at 9:00am at the Mt. Pinos Nordic Base parking lot at the end of Mount Pinos Road (GPS: Cuddy Valley Rd, Forest Rte 9N24, Frazier Park, CA 93225 – or – coordinates 34.8134, -119.1263). Please note that each vehicle that parks at the Mt. Pinos Nordic Base parking lot will need to display a valid Adventure Pass. Bundle warm! Target species include - Clark's Nutcracker, Mountain Chickadee, Red Crossbill, Williamson's Sapsucker, and Evening Grosbeak.

Saturday, Nov 18th - Arroyo Vista Community Park

Bordering the Arroyo Simi in Moorpark, this park provides a good mix of open space and shrubs for a variety of bird habitat. Meet at the end of the parking lot by the footbridge over the arroyo at 8 a.m. Target species include - Lark Sparrows, Red-breasted Nuthatch, wintering warblers and waterfowl. Afterwards, we will meet at the Country Harvest Cafe for brunch around 11:30 a.m.

Saturday, Nov. 25th - Sapwi Trails Community Park

Sapwi Trails provides excellent habitat for overwintering sparrows and raptors. Meet at the Westlake Rd. parking lot. Just be mindful of the flying discs! Target species include Golden-crowned Sparrows, sapsuckers, and raptor species.

Wednesday, November 8th, 8:00 am – Beginner Bird Walk

Conejo Valley Audubon invites birders of all experience levels to attend our monthly Beginner Bird Walk at Rancho Sierra Vista/Satwiwa. These walks are held on the second Wednesday of each month. We will meet at 8:00 am at the main parking lot, which is accessible off Lynn Road at Via Goleta in Newbury Park. Rancho Sierra Vista is an excellent place to see many of the oak woodlands birds that are common in the Conejo Valley area. We will take time to introduce beginning birders to these species and will teach the best techniques for locating and identifying them. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Bring water and social distance.
